#### Bad Old as Low?

#### The Town

- District Town in Schleswig-Holstein, Germany
- Appr. 25.000 Inhabitants

#### The Library

- 40.000 items, Ebooks, etc.
- 1050 sqm space (including offices & room for events)
- 7 employees
- Elementary school in the neighborhood

- Progressive politics on refugees
- Fair Trade Town since 2015



#### The Green Library – still on the Agenda!

"The conversation about sustainability and libraries is no longer a pet project but rather a vital part of the strategy to ensure that libraries are around for the long haul" (Rebecca Smith-Aldrich, 2017)

#### Approach in general

- Libraries can act as a key institutions on ecological, environmental and social problems
- the ideas of green and sustainable libraries can work as theoretical background for practical library services

#### **Approach in Germany**

- By developing new services, the Stadtbibliothek:
  - gives a broader idea of public library services to local society and politics
  - shows its relevance by connecting the aims of public libraries with issues on environment and sustainability
  - strengthens the idea of the green library in Germany through practical examples
  - shows new ideas on the significance of public libraries in Germany



#### Ideas

#### The Library (in general):

- reacts on new forms of learning and the need for meeting spaces in a digital society
- connects the idea of green and sustainable libraries with social and political developments by providing new services
- considers Urban Gardening as an expression for the needs of the digital society – DIY, Maker, new public spaces, low-intensive meeting places

#### Aims

#### The Stadtbibliothek:

- creates an annual series of events on environmental and sustainable issues
- ties in with the very vital civic society to focus on the needs of the community
- develops new cooperations with the civic society
- transforms to a low-intensive meeting place
- offers its room as a platform to the civic society
- presents itself as a modern & creative space for learning
- supports new initiatives in the city and community
- tests new forms of services
- connects books and media with the community and their needs
- connects people and initiatives by issues of environmental and sustainable thinking



#### "Harvest your City" 2015...

- ...started as a university project for the MA-Library- and Information Science
- ...planned as a series of events and a makerspace on the topics of Urban Gardening
- ...developed new cooperations between the library and the civic society







By organizing a special day of action, the library offered a presentation of books and media on Urban Gardening...





...opened an exhibition...

(which started one week earlier to attract people to the forthcoming event)





...organised a lecture by Dr. Meyer-Renschhausen on Urban Gardening worldwide...





...offered a workshop and seed savers exchange by the "Gartendeck"...

(a community garden in Hamburg-St.Pauli)





...and started the children's competition "the quickest bean in town."





After the opening of this event, the librarians stepped behind their desks and let the Stadtbibliothek turn into a meeting place on the issue of urban gardening.



(No librarians in this picture!)



The seed savers exchange was very well attended...





...and the people started to talk to each other and (with the help of coffee and biscuits) turned the library into a low intensive meeting place.





The Insect Hotel
Makerspace a few weeks
later was organised for a
class of the neighboring
elementary school.





The barrow in the foyer was the first sign about the forthcomming event.





Tools and old cans turned to be important ,media' on this day and brought the idea of upcycling closer to the kids.





With the help of experts,...





...their own ambition...





...and their creativity...





...the class built an insect hotel...





...which found its place at the school garden.





#### **Outcomes of the 2015 events:**

- the Makerspace strongly improved the identification of the children with the Stadtbibliothek
- many requests for the books & media about "Urban Gardening"
- angry municipal gardeners (seed bombs!!)
- presenting the event at the Kulturstiftung des Bundes (Federal Foundation for Culture) concerning the so-called TRAFO-Programm
- Stadtbibliothek improved visibility as possible partner for future cooperation
- mediate an urban gardening cooperation between senior citizens and underprivileged children



(as a result of the mediation, one cucumber of the harvest was given to the Stadtbibliothek!)



#### "Harvest your City" 2016:

- ...continued after the successful beginning in 2015
- ...worked out new forms of library services
- ...tried to get ,outside the box'
- ...planned a series of events on local food and nature in urban spaces
- ...developed new cooperations between the library and the civic society





This event started with very common aspects of typical library services: ...







... Informationboards about (medical) herbs...





...and a small exhibition on local fruits and vegetables are no groundbreaking library services in Germany.





Rather the idea was to turn the library into a place once again, where people can meet experts, get in contact with each other and get information on environmental and sustainability issues.







The very uncommon aspect was that the library left it's ,box' and turned the urban space into a learning environment. The library organized a guided walking tour about natural herbs in parks and on roadsides...





...and a cycling tour to local trees and bushes in public domain to harvest their fruits.





The people learned about their local environment,...





... got in contact with each other and even harvested.





Afterwards the two groups gathered in the library again, where the local foodsharing-group offered their ,rescued food' from the local market.





The latter got in contact with the other participants...





... and so, the library again turned into a low-intensive meeting place for citizens and the players of the civic society.





Everyone could leave the library with a lot of new impressions on environmental and sustainabilty issues, meet new people and ,rescue' some food.





#### **Outcomes of the 2016 events:**

- the Stadtbibliothek turned into a part of a local network on sustainability and environmental protection
- fostered commitment on local environmental and sustainability issues
- "Harvest your City" became part of the ,Wandelwoche' (week for social and ecological change)
- became a civic hub for local environmental and sustainability issues
- As a result, the first local CSA found enough supporters to start their business!





#### 2017 - and it grows

#### "Harvest your City 2017":

- ...widening the concept to a whole weekend of action in the entire town
- ...working together with the local authority for environmental protection, the local centre for culture und education (KuB), the civic society and the local economy (the local CSA and Hanseobst)
- ...embedded in the ,Wandelwoche' (Week of social and ecological change) in October 2017
- ...exhibtion, lecture, events for kids, seed savers exchange, foodsharing, the local community garden, bicycle tour, guided walking tour for herbs, etc.



#### 2018 – and it grows?

#### "Harvest your City" 2018:

- "Harvest your City" remains an annual event
- plans to return in Spring to strengthen the aspect of seeds
- thoughts on setting up a seed library in the Stadtbibliothek



#### Conclusion I: Overall critique

- Huge efforts for organisation necessary
- Difficult to adress all parts of the society within one day/weekend of events
- Difficult to offer special services for kids and children



#### Conclusion II: Overall outcomes

#### The Stadtbibliothek

- Became a part of a local network on sustainability and environmental protection
- Widened its idea of a public library services
- Turned into a meeting space for the community and brought people together
- Increased its positive image in the community
- Took responsibility for local issues on sustainability and environmental protection
- Supported local initiatives and economies and connected them with local politics
- Received positive response from local politicians
